Letter from Our Executive Director

Dear Friends,

For more than 43 years, thousands of individuals of all ages, from all walks of life, have trusted Mutual Ground to provide life-changing services that have empowered them to end the cycle of domestic and/ or sexual violence. For the last three years Mutual Ground faced a precarious situation as the budget crisis in Illinois played out. These circumstances left us no choice but to make budget cuts that impacted our programming.

What this meant was waiting lists for adult and children's counseling services that are finally being whittled down as we are allowed to rehire these important staff positions. As you can imagine, having waiting lists for our services is frustrating as there are members of our community who are suffering, and even dying, as the result of domestic and sexual violence. We were lucky to have our community's support during these trying times — it allowed us to keep providing life-saving services during the most difficult of situations.

Recently, a mother of three came to Mutual Ground "needy and emotionally drained", and in fear for her life. What she received was a safe place to stay, counseling services for herself and her three beautiful children, help getting resources to move on and better her life, and "the confidence needed to move forward". It is truly difficult to comprehend the strength and courage required of a woman facing this lonely path. We are honored to assist her in her journey, and grateful for the contributions of all of our supporters.

Thank you for being a friend of Mutual Ground – together we will continue to work towards our goal of ending domestic and sexual abuse.

Service Spotlight: Prevention Education

Mutual Ground strongly believes that education is a key element in the prevention of domestic violence and sexual assault. Our prevention program promotes awareness and is an important first step in breaking the cycle of abuse.

We work with the majority of the public school districts in Kendall and Southern Kane County, as well as every public school in the City of Aurora from kindergarten to grade 12. We currently present to 51 schools in our service area.

Our Prevention Educators educate students about abuse, provide them with the tools needed to break the cycle of violence, inform students what to do if they find themselves in an abusive situation, and empower them to take a stand against violence and confide in a trusted adult. Our program also allows students to come forward with abuse in private room disclosures.

This past academic year, our Prevention Educators gave 2,480 individual presentations, 153 bilingual presentations, and made 60,884 student contacts. Mutual Ground Educators also received 94 abuse disclosures from students and 10 disclosures from adults who have encountered domestic or sexual violence at some point in their lifetime.

The demand for Prevention Education Services continues to grow. A new Prevention Educator recently joined the



team to help fulfill an increasing number of schools we are supporting, as well as cover for other educators during planned and unplanned absences.

Survivor's Art Show

This inspirational and educational event is open to the public free of charge. The show will exhibit art created by Mutual Ground's clients and art contributed by community artists interested in supporting Mutual Ground and raising awareness around sexual assault/abuse issues.

The artists displayed in this show were asked to use a medium of their choice to visually capture the complex process of healing. Artists were encouraged to try and illustrate the wide range of emotions related to a survivor's healing journey.

The art exhibit is free of charge, but will include a silent auction with all proceeds directly benefiting Mutual Ground.
