Happy New Year!

It's hard to believe that 2018 is already here. We hope you had a wonderful Holiday season!

Our Holiday season was rewarding due to so many of you donating to our annual holiday mailing and helping us with our Santa's Workshop. At Santa's Workshop the women and children who are utilizing our services had the opportunity peruse all of the items and pick that special gift to be given to their family members. We were able to bring joy to the hearts of 33 adults and 78 children through this program thanks to our generous donors!

Although we were able to help so many throughout the holidays, the sad reminder of the need for our services was evident. In October and November of last year alone, we received 379 calls to our emergency hot-line for domestic violence crisis situations or requests for new service. This is a 24% increase from the prior year! Is it because domestic violence was more prevalent in 2017? We don't think so. We think, and hope, that we are getting our message out to those in need that we are here to help, free of charge, anytime that is needed.

While it is depressing to think of individuals enduring the hardship of domestic violence during a joyous holiday season, it is the reality. We are incredibly thankful to have your support as we enter the new year, and feel that together we can make a difference and help our clients achieve a life free of violence.

Thank you again for your commitment to helping us end the cycle of domestic and sexual violence. With the programming we have in place, and your support, I am excited to see where 2018 takes us!

Service Spotlight: Shelter Program

Survivors of domestic violence are often told to "just leave" their abusive partners. If only it could be that simple. Statistics show that the most dangerous time for a victim is when they decide to leave an abusive relationship. At Mutual Ground, we provide



the keys victims need to break the cycle of the number of victims served through our domestic violence.

When female clients and their children are Last year, 90 women and 113 children in danger and have no other support system in place, we provide a safe haven at our emergency shelter. We can also arrange accommodations for family pets. Our shelter is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

In light of the pervious Illinois State Budget impasse, this year the Domestic Violence Department focused, primarily, on maintaining essential services related to safety. While significant changes were inhibited by the lack of sufficient funding, we were able to make some positive changes to the shelter program. Mutual Ground implemented changes to shelter intake policies and procedure in order to increase

had a safe place to call home at Mutual Ground. We provided 5960 nights of shelter for women and children and the average stay for clients and families in shelter was 29 nights. In addition to shelter, residents received counseling, legal advocacy, vocational and housing guidance, and children's programming.

Mutual Ground is an emergency shelter, which means clients are able to stay at our shelter for up to 45 days, free of charge. During those 45 days, our team provides support and resources to clients to help them transition to a safe place after they leave the shelter.

Shelter Residents

We have seen an increase in the number of residents and the average nights of stay compared to last year.

In October and November of 2017, our shelter provided accommodations for 22 women and 34 children and the average nights of stay per head of household was 22 days.

We believe this increase is due to women in the community becoming more empowered to seek help and break the cycle of domestic violence.

Shelter Census (Fiscal Year '18 to Date)

The Mutual Ground Shelter has 28 beds and 7 cribs for residents.

In Fiscal Year '18 we have currently had an 80% occupancy rate. It is not uncommon for our shelter to be at full capacity multiple times during the year.

During their stay, shelter residents will receive guidance from our counselors to find housing after they leave the shelter.


Shelter Residents October - November 2017

Recovery After a Controlling Relationship

Leaving an abusive relationship is never easy, but how do survivors begin the healing processes after leaving? Every survivor recovers from abuse in their own ways, but here are just a few ways survivors can begin to recover and heal after leaving a controlling relationship:

- Reclaiming activities that had been blocked by the abuser
- Connecting with family, friends, and supportive professionals
- Organizing time and physical space to feel less overwhelmed
- Verbalizing and sharing the true story of the relationship, in ways that feel right
- Expressing oneself creatively through art, poetry, journaling, dancing, singing, or other hobbies
- Resuming a regular schedule when ready to do so
- Reclaiming one's own body through physical activity and eating well.
